THE character of the weather prevailing the present winter has very strongly emphasized the claim for the establishment of water works. On every hand one hears complaints, if not of a water famine in the strictest sense. of a great scarcity of water; of wells being dry that have scarcely ever been dry before of cisterns and tanks being empty because there has been no fall of rain to replenish them. The river or the creek is the general resort for water for all purposes. Now, of course, this result of some elemental law of nature is not a providental dispensation especially designed for the purpose, but it has a moral that bears very directly on the water question. We cannot qualify the weather if it don't rain we can't help it, but what we can do is to provide a means of supply that may be sure when the more natural means fail, and by which the water from the river may be laid on before every man's door and, if he wishes it, within every domicile. Many who never before did so will this winter appreciate the importance of water supply, and will watch with anxiety the further action of Wakefield, our Council in the direction of securing it.
