SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Jan. 24 - Informa tion has been received at Brisbane, Queens land, that a large three-masted schooner was lost at the mouth of the Fly River, New Guicea. The crew, seventeen in number, were killed by savages, their heads being cut off and distributed among the native villages Captain Pennafeather, of the schooner Pearl, made a search, but found only a lot of wreckage with nothing to identify the vessel. His party were attacked several times by the natives. One old woman confessed that the crew had been murdered. Captain Pennafeather burned the native villages and destroyed their cances.

C. LUMB A, S. C., Jan. 29 .- On Saturday morning the family of nine negroes living on a plantation in Lausens County killed and ate of a goose that had been bitten by a dog supposed to be mad. Two hours thereafter the entire family became sick and thrown into convulsions. Four died last night; other five not expected to live.

Too Much Unmarrying .- Maine has had 2,400 divorces in three years. New Brunswick has not had a half-dozen in the same length of time. To be sure, our population is not much more than a third of that of Maine; but even allowing for this, the frequency with which the marriage tie is loosened amonget our neighbors shows the existence of an extraordinary state of things. It seems likely that at the session of the State Legislature now being held, the Divorce Laws will be amended, with a view to lessen the number of judicial separations. In a State where ten per cent. of the marriages are declared null and void, every year, there would seem to be a good field for reform of some kind. The existing state of things is a flagrant scandal and disgrace, tending to the destruction of the social system. The cause of this state of things, whether arising out of hasty and ill-considered marriages, or of the ease with which divorces can be obtained, demand the serious attention of the people of


