LIFE IN THE MIKADO'S EMPIRE.—Everyone, rich and poor, in Japan takes a dip at least once a day in a caldron of hot water. The

A bath, unless at a thermal spring, is only an immersion. Precedence is given to the elders, when there are no visitors then to the young people, according to their age, next to the maid-servants, and lastly to the women. Prefatory ablutions of feet and hands are performed in basins, and on getting out of the caldron each bather gargles mouth and throat with cold aromatized water. In very hot weather they all fan each other's bodies to dry them. Modesty does not begin in Japan where beauty ends. Human beings who are as fat and shapeless as two presperous quails do not mind being fanned. The nobility never went naked in the streets.
