

ATTACK BY CONVICTS .- One of the most

tirilling and at the same time an unprecedent dact of gratitude was witnessed on Monday at the Dartmoor Prison, at Princetown, sixteen miles from Plymouth, England. One of the life convicts in the prison, named Stevens, had been pardoned by the Gevernment, and as he was leaving his old quarters a gang of convicts who were at work in the quarries, taking advantage of the moment when their warder bad his back turned upon hem in bidding Stevens good-bye, rushed upon the warder, in an attempt to escape, and disarmed him, throwing him to the ground. In the tussel which ensued the warder's repeating rifle flew in the direction of Stevens. He immediately seized it, and, to the surprise of his recent companions, he opened fire on them, shooting six of the convicts who had, on discerning his object in securing the gun, attempted to treat him in the same manner as they did the warder. The powder then gave out, and Stevens, who is a powerfully built man, clubbed the gun, and with the butt end laid out five more of the convicts, when his companions, becoming alarmed at his terrific onslaught on them, returned to their work perfectly cowed.
