

A FORTNIGHT ago, in giving an account of there -dedication of the Woodstock Methodist Church, we referred to the fact that the Chapel Steward, Mr. G. L Holyoke, read a portion of an historical record of the church for the past fifty years, which was in preparation, and stated that we would publish the record when completed, if requested to do so. Mr. Holyoke has handed us the paper referred to, and we give it below with pleasure :

THE WOODSTOCK METHODIST CHURCH. Previous to 1832 Woodstock and the parts adjacent thereto had been favored occasionally with the preaching of the Word by Methodist ministers from circuits then established in the Province.
