On the St. Louis bridge proper the rails had been known to creep 260 feet in one year, and on the bridge approach 400 feet. This creeping varied with the amount of traffic or with the weight carried over the rails. On the St. Louis bridge the rails crept in the direction with traffic. These rails were supported from their base.
