THE PARLIAMENT BUILDINGS The Parliament Buildings are in all probaility the most pretentious public buildings on the continent. As they stand with the main edifice in the background, and the eastern block and western block at the sides, at right angles with and in front of the main building, they present a very imposing appearance.
