The report by the Commissioner to the Minister of Inland Revenue, on Adulteration Food, is a document containing much mater of interest to all corsumers who, while they think they do know, really in many cases do not know what they eat and drink. The total number of samples analysed by the Dominion analysts was 1243, of which 302 were adulterated, 911 genuine, and 30


