STATIONERY IN NEW ENGLAND.—Norwich, Conn., Oct. 12.—The large Falls Cotton Mills of this place shut down over six weeks ago, and the outlook is that they will remain closed all winter. Between 400 and 500 operatives were thrown out of work and six weeks of idleness has reduced most of them to destitution. For a while they were allowed to leave the company's store, but with a week or two that source of supply of daily necessities has been shut off. What they are to do they do not know. They have no money with which to migrate to other mill towns, and even if they had the money the universal industrial stagnation throughout New England promises only a change of scene and equal or greater wretchedness. Most of the operatives have large families, are ragged and hungry. They have no money to buy food clothes with, and they cannot keep warm or cook by the blaze of Blaine torchlight processes which noisily trumpet through the mill settlements almost nightly, blindingly illuminating motteous "Do you want to retain our property? Then vote for Blaine and Lugen." These people will have to starve this winter or apply to the town for help. They have begun to apply already. Rows of women and half-grown girls, many of them weeping, are seen at the selectmen's office daily asking for a dollar or two to buy food with. In all the mill villages in this part of the state and in every other part of New England the situation is pretty much the same. In all the mill villages the help have "lived from hand to mouth." That is what they call it, and they mean that at the end of each week their earnings being but a trifle more than the money for the necessities of life, they are left with nothing but a bare subsistence, and they cannot get a cent of one cent more or a paper of pine with which to buy food and clothing.

At the week's end he is paid the balance of his wages, if there is a balance above his store accounts. Generally there is none. In mill villages all the tenants are the property of the company. When the mill shuts down and there is no longer any "true" at the store, the operative is in almost a helpless condition as to how to get a crust from day to day. In the city of four of the five mill villages have been closed for months. There are no operatives training in the political torchlight process this fall. It is the opinion of observers, whose business obliges them to visit all parts of New England, that the coming winter will witness suffering and wretchedness among the working people unparalleled in the history of the country.

Business men at Toronto say that the failure of James Campbell & Co. will have a disastrous effect upon the course of book stores there throughout the country. It is probable that a large publishing house and a large book store in Toronto will collapse. The liabilities of the firm are placed at \$300,000, of which about \$100,000 is accommodation paper, and it is believed the estate will not realize ten cents on the dollar. The Merchants' Bank holds about \$120,000 worth of paper, a great portion being specially secured. The Bank of Montreal has \$37,000 worth, and the Commercial Bank of New Brunswick, which were lost in a wrecked steamer, were subsequently recovered by parties who put them in circulation. They are genuine, with the exception of the signatures, which have been taken from the original and copied by the counterfeiters. They can readily be detected by the numbers, as the numbers being between 9,000 and 9,900.

LENATICS TORTURE.—Montreal, Oct. 15.—Dr. Hook Lake, the famous English expert, has published a report on the condition of the Government Lunatic Asylums in this Province, in which he says it is impossible to convey an adequate idea of the horrors he witnessed, and he only likens the treatment adopted as relief of barbarism. In the upper part of a small room, round the walls of which were hung, in a row, the heads of the inmates, who were all under restraint, handcuffed and strapped to chairs. In other parts of the building he found cells without windows and with wretched ventilation. In a totally dark cell he discovered a man stark naked lying on straw and handcuffed to a belt; in another a man of mad and dumb, similarly manacled, without bed or bedding. The women's room he described as a chamber of horrors, and even more terrible than the part where the men are kept. In conclusion, he says that it is amazing that the policy of England can present such a spectacle as has been described. One asylum is under the charge of the nuns, and a government inquiry will be instituted.

FRANCE-ENGLISH TROUBLES.—London, Oct. 12.—A speck of war is found in the communications which have passed between England and France in regard to the stopping and searching of English vessels on the Chinese coast for contraband and war material. It is stated that England has vigorously protested against the order given to French commanders to search English vessels, and that the correspondence between the English and French Consuls is getting warmer than is warranted by ordinary diplomatic courtesy. It is known that England has demanded a searching enquiry into the circumstances of the destruction of the English steamer, and a *cass belli* may be established if it is ascertained that goods are being exported by Englishmen have been seized.

A London despatch of the 14th says: After the celebration of mass yesterday in St. Peter's, the bishop of the diocese and the clergy and congregation, numbering 500, proceeded to the shrine of Edward the Confessor in Westminster Abbey, where they knelt and prayed for the conversion of England to the ancient faith. The people made the sign of the cross. They were not disturbed by the verger. The visitors at the abbey were much astonished by the proceeding.
