THE LONGEST SINGLE SPAN GIRDER.-The new railroad bridge over the Onio between Evansville, Ind., and Henderson, Ky., which was formally opened for traffic in the early part of August, enjoys the distinction of having the longest single span girder of any bridge yet constructed. It is built on the tri-angular truss plan, and is very symmetrical and pleasing in appearance. The structure has a length of 3,200 feet, and rests on sixteen piers, each span being 250 feet long, with the exception of the one over the main channel. Tors is 525 feet, and is, we believe, the longest single girder in the world. It is 1034 feet above high water mark. The bridge, with the lines connecting the railroad system centering at Evansville with the Louisville and Nashville system at Henderson, has a length of ten miles, three miles of the approach on the Indiana side being over a wooden trestle. - Scientific American.
