

CRUSHED TO DEATH - Paris, June 14 -At Theirs, in the department of Puy de Darne, while crowds of people were leaving the court house where they had been attending a murder trial, the stone staircase leading to the street fell. The scene that followed was appalling. Immense masses of masonry from above crashed down upon the struggling people below, grinding through their flesh and hones, and maiming and mutilating them in a horrible manner. The fall of the staircase and shricks of people lying helpless in the ruins caused a panic in the court room, and there was a rush for an exit. Those in front were unable to withstand the pressure from behind and were hurled down upon the men and women crushed in the fall of the staircase, and whom the people in the street were already striving to rescue. When the panic had exhausted itself, and the immense stone steps of the fallen staircase had been removed, 20 persons were taken from the ruins dead. The injured numbered not less than 60; and many will die of their injuries.
