AT THE NEW ORLEANS EXHIBITION.

No. 3.

The World's Exhibition! What is it like? And how does it compare with others of its kind? It is conceded by most, especially by those who attended the one in 1883 at Philadelphia, that this is far superior in some respects, equally as good in others, and in no way does it fall short, if we except the attendance which, up to the 12th of Feb., was small indeed. Foreigners also were pleased with it and state that it is by far the greatest Exhibition the world has ever seen.

As we enter the first time we are almost lost in wonder and admiration, as we gaze on the vast array of sights and wonders that greet the eye on every hand, and listen to the hum and buzz of the thousands and more machines, almost human in their dexterity. What power has man that by the aid of these things can start on quiet and inactivity all the various parts of the most wonderful collection of labor-saving inventions that have ever yet been brought together, for the eye of man to gaze upon and the mind to ponder their mysteries. The visitor can start at the ponderous engine, the breezy from the great wheel, and passing almost make one great big hat, and passing along the huge of wheels turned into the by the different processes. The silk cotton spinning, the thread, which is spun into it from and made into beautiful handkerchiefs, book marks, etc. Here also is the cotton in the bud and raw cotton and how many are being machined and passed through the twenty operations in simultaneous process, which convert the raw cotton into a nice spool of thread, one of which you may take gratis, here they are making tin mugs and glass cups; here they are weaving carpets of all kinds, cheap and costly; and behold here, by the aid of a fine mill is a sausage chugger. But it is needless to enumerate as every known machine is said to be here, and all are in operation doing their best.

It is pleasant to travel and see the habits and customs of different people in foreign countries, but here they are brought to see you. The Turk with his beard and turban, the Russian and the strange things from that country. Of all the foreign countries none give me more attention than Japan. Her habit is very fine; her people are cultured and refined, so different from the Chinese who almost always have a dirty look. Next to Japan, we visit Mexico, who has the greatest number of interesting exhibits, her native wares are admired by every one. British Honduras has a good show. Among her exhibits is a small boat 14 inches deep, 12 feet in diameter, also a log of same wood 30 feet long, 4 feet diameter. The Jamaica exhibits are looked after by a colored man, who is that island, over 6 feet high, good featured, more like a white than a negro, and a fine figure, wears a cap with tassels, red shirt, blue pants coming down to his knees, white stockings. There are some very comical things. The Mogulians are exhibited in a room with shed roof, in the top corner of which hangs a large hanging lamp. The room is a coal fire, nice pictures on wall, dining table in centre set for two, with a delicious looking ham on platter, pitcher of water, and two goblets, at the head of the table is a white dog, in large easy chair, dressed in black suit, white vest and tie, and stand on collar, his hand on the back of his chair, it is adorned with peacock feathers. At the opposite side of the table is Mrs. Hog, color black, dressed in silk, long train; she holds a small dog in her hand. Pickled hams are exhibited in bins with glass doors. Each nation, each state and, in fact, private exhibitor strives to have some of the features of the exhibition. The feature of the exhibition is the most interesting to take the attention and interest the people. The exhibit of military, dress, etc., with all the other many of interest to the fair sex would need to be seen by them to be appreciated.

The Greeley Arctic Relief Expedition is here in detail, boats, dogs, sledges, provisions, beds, harp, gun, etc., and in great interest to all. The Globe is represented by a large glass ball suspended in the air; the great divisions of the world and large islands are painted on the outside.

We ascend a flight of stairs on the west side and find many things to interest, among them different gods and forms of worship by different nations, ancient and modern. The trade returns of the countries of the world are given here, and the pride of every subject of the fair sex is pleased as the figures are read.

Another object of interest is the first steam railway locomotive; also first train of cars ever run in America. Turning face about you look from these ancient appearing vehicles (as they are more like wagons than cars) and look at the steamy engine of the present with its train of magnificent cars so rich and luxurious; one is led to exclaim what will the end be!

The grandest of all from England in every shape ground and in block form make so high a mound you can scarcely see the top.

The first train of cars set in England, price \$2000; a steam work, \$200. Illinois shows a bed of roses on a costly bedstead.

THE SOUDAN.

LONDON, Feb. 21.—An Arabian paper reports that the Mahdi promised Fara 140,000 dollars to betray Khartoum, but gave him only 20,000, and when Fara complained the Mahdi hanged him. It is said that the Mahdi captured 15,000 Remington rifles at Khartoum.

Efforts to induce the Porte to abandon the idea of an expedition to Egypt are being made. The Grand Vizier and Foreign Minister have told Wladimir that the Porte's decision is final, and that the best guarantee against further annexation on the Red Sea coast is the Turkish occupation of the principal points.

Gen. Sir George Graham, who is to command the Sudan Expedition, started for Sudan last night.

Khartoum, Feb. 22.—Two hundred and twenty-five of Gordon's black troops, accompanied by their wives and families, who had reached Khartoum before Khartoum fell, have arrived at Ambok and gone into camp there.

The growing heat will shortly compel the removal of the British camp to some place further north.

A despatch from Abu Kheir says: "Gen. Buller who arrived here on the 15th from Khartoum, commenced at noon, the 17th, a systematic sifting of the Arab lines. Two well directed shots did the enemy great damage, one exploding amidst a group of men engaged in playing a board game on the summit of a hill east of our soldier's fort, and the other removing the wheel of a gun carriage. Lord Charles Blandford also did the enemy great injury with the Gardner gun. The honors of the day fell to Major Wardrop, who, with 13 men, alone routed the enemy's right and left, and they had only a few hundred riflemen on the hills and no reserve spearmen. Major Wardrop and his men, keeping out of sight, sent volleys at the range of 800 yards, on the enemy's flank, leaving one man at this point to continue the firing, he took 12 others and as quickly as possible pursued the same tactics at three successive hills, the Arabs giving the impression that fresh bodies of British troops were arriving. The Mahdi's forces became panic-stricken, crossed firing and decamped towards Mehera, leaving all their guns and dead and wounded with them. Few Arabs' souls only were left three miles off to watch the march of the British. There has been no sign of the enemy since. General Buller will advance to Gakal and some reinforcements arrive from Khartoum. The British loss during the engagement was four killed and 25 wounded."
