The Hoes have **oval-shaped shares**, which experience has shown to be by far the best shape for killing weeds; as, as a Flat or Diamond shaped point, in order to keep clear, must be run so flat that the weeds are left standing ready to grow after the first shower, while the Oval Point scatters them and leaves them to wither and die. As a **Cultivator** it will thoroughly pulverize the ground and destroy the weeds. As a **Horse Hoe** it will make the Drill cover the potatoes, cut and draw away the earth or weeds from the row, hill them up, and very materially assist in the digging of them. Being composed almost entirely of **wrought iron and steel** it combines Lightness and Strength in the greatest possible degree. It is no exaggeration to say that, with it, a man and boy can hoe more potatoes in a day than four men could do with a Plow and Hand Hoes.
