

and slit the legs from the hoof to the belly, finished into leather. 4th. Skin the head and legs carefully: 5th. Commencing at the head, so as to avoid cutting or scoring at the butt, near the tail, draw

or fist off the skin without any further use of the kuife, thereby avoiding those holes, cuts and scratches which so much injure the skin. Some farmers use a windlars to draw off their Dairy Skins, others a horse, but two men (one stout man can do it) can pull off a skin very quickly.


