WOMAN SUFFRAGE IN THE WEST .- Seattle. Dec. 1.—The scenes presented at the polls in this Territory on Nov. 4 possessed a most unusual interest. It was the second occasion on which the women had had an opportunity to vote since the woman suffrage laws went into operation. The first occasion was in June last and then the woman suffrage. June last, and then the women appeared to pay little attention to their newly established rights as citizens but at the last election they went to the polls in force. It is doubtful if more than one in ten of the adult female inhabitants of the Territory neglected on Nov. 4 to exercise her right to vote. The presence of the women changed the whole appearance of the polling places. They were surrounded by shrubs and flowers, and the ballot boxes were in some cases adorned with flowers and garlands. Rough men became well behaved, and paid great attention to their personal appearance, and the ladies who peddled tickets and electioneered around the polls were treated with much respect. 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


