It appears that Lord Wolseley has decided to abandon the attempt to reach Shendy by the desert route from Korti, thus cutting off the great bend in the Nile. The difficulties of the way seem to him too great to be surmounted with the resources at his command. Instead of this route, he will use the road from Meraweh to Beiber, likewise through the desert, but much shorter than the other. 'He has accordingly changed the base for the concentration of his force from Korti to Meraweh.
