Southern Pines, N. C., July 30 1885. The city of Raleigh, with its ancient park and its wealth of historic interest, with a population estimated at about thirteen thousand, is without water works. Water for all purposes comes from wells, which pierce the earth to the depth of from thirty to fifty feet The coldest and purest water in the whole city is quaffed from the well in the State House park.

The Neuse river is about five miles from Raleigh, while the Haw river is over thirty niles distant, yet it is estimated that it would be cheaper to bring Haw river to Raleigh than it would be to tap the Neuse. The absence of water works is very keenly felt, especially in times of drouth, when






