



WE have before us a copy of the Report relative to manufacturing interests in existence in Canada, prepared at the instance of the Dominion Government during the last year and submitted to Parliament. Hon. E. Willis was the commissioner for the Maritime Provinces. Turning to the report on the industries of Woodstock and Carleton county, we find it stated, first generally, that in Woodstock in 1878 there were of hands employed 318, of whom 50 were boys and females, the total average weekly wages paid peing \$2,464.90; and in 1884 there were 475 hands employed, 84 being boys and females, the total average weekly wages being \$3,-692 60, the average weekly wages being thus very nearly the same per head in each period. We note here the fact shews that
