The morality of happiness is discussed in the *Popular Science Monthly* by a writer who says of home life:—
Consider home life for example. In nearly every home there are those who are disposed to take unfair advantage of the rest; and they are far better restrained by the influence of their attempts than by any other way, certainly better than by yielding continued till nothing but the anger urged by some attempt more far-reaching than the rest, moves to resistance. We see this especially exemplified in the families of carious parents—unsilphic, perhaps in a sense but really negligent of their duties. It has been said for this reason that unsilphic parents have commonly selfish children, which seems contrary to the law of heredity, but illustrates rather the natural influence of defective training. The fact really is that children of selfish parents are as a rule more selfish in character than those of the unsilphic; they grow up to be as unpleasant in their ways as the children of carious, unwholesome parents; and their unpleasantness is more apt to be permanent. Yet the unwholesome ways of children whose parents yield unwisely to them illustrate well on a small scale (even though happily the mischief is often transient) how the assertion of just claims, and the restraint of wrongdoing, involve a form of egotism which must be regarded as a duty.

AGES AT WHICH THE QUEEN'S CHILDREN HAVE BEEN MARRIED.—It is interesting to compare the different ages at which Her Majesty's children have been married. The Princess Beatrice is now betrothed in her twenty-eighth year, the Princess Royal married in her eighteenth year, the Princess Alice in her twentieth year, the Duke of Edinburgh in his thirtieth year, the Princess Helena in her twenty-first year, the Princess Louise in her twenty-fourth year, the Duke of Connaught in his twenty-ninth year, the Duke of Albany in his thirtieth year. The united ages, at marriage, of the five Royal Princesses make 111 years, the united ages at marriage of the four Princes make 111 years. By striking an average one finds that Princesses are married at 22.5 years, and Princes at 27.4.

There is a sweet pleasure in contemplation, and when a man hath run through a set of vanities in the declension of his age, he knows not what to do with himself if he cannot think.

When shrewd ingenuity resorts to dishonest methods, the confiding public is apt to suffer in pocket.
