Tax proceedings of the Town Council board  
on the evening of the 12th will have been  
read in the report published in this paper  
with a feeling of pleasure. The good feeling  
existing among the members of the Council  
at the close of their term of office and on the  
eve of the retirement of some of the men  
was in the most kindly sentiments. And  
we know their sentiments were not the ex-  
pressions of mere mutual admiration, but  
heartily, honest, and deserved. We are in  
most cordial sympathy with the spirit and  
terms of the resolution of thanks tendered  
the Mayor and Councilor Lynch.

Mr. Jones has, during his incumbency of office,  
discharged his duties as Mayor, as fully to  
the satisfaction of the people as the Council.  
The fact that during his regime ad-  
under his advice and direction the water  
works have been so satisfactorily and suc-  
cessfully introduced and completed will remain  
as it now is a testimonial more eloquent  
than any ennoblement of words.

And of Mr. Lynch it may safely be said  
that his services in the same connection were  
valuable as he was a councillor for three  
years, and as a councillor equally as a citizen  
the Sentinel entertains the highest regard, and  
he retires from the Council with a worthy  
record.

Not should it be forgotten that Messrs.  
Everett and Graham, retiring councillors,  
have both served the town lengthily, and  
leaving to their successors an official example  
that may safely be followed.

In the English Parliament, when a dis-  
position was shown to criticize the Govern-  
ment in regard to its attitude towards Ger-  
many, Mr. Gladstone delivered these  
patriotic utterances. He said he wished it  
was distinctly understood that Prince Bi-  
smarck's despatch of May 5 had never been  
delivered to the English government. His  
regretted this because the despatch would  
have received all the friendly attention it well  
deserved. He declared he would stand be-  
hind no man in the value he attached to the  
friendship of Germany. He must say, how-  
ever, he was not prepared to admit the  
friendship of any country in the world was  
now or ever had been necessary to enable  
England to maintain her position. If Ger-  
many became a colonizing power, he would  
only say God speed to her. He hoped she  
would become England's partner and ally in  
the work of civilizing the world.

Tas following from Paris, France, is an-  
other encouraging evidence that the Fenian  
and Dynamite are not to be allowed to  
initiate their vile projects and to protect the  
civilized government. An intense ten-  
sion has been caused in this city by the  
stand that the authorities have taken toward  
Fenian agitators. In regard to the arrest  
of James Stephens, Eugene Davis and John  
Morrissey, made recently, the police have  
arrested a journalist named Mortimer Leroy  
and another Fenian whose name is not  
learned. Stephens, Davis and Leroy were  
warned not to return to France to-day and  
were not allowed to return. Morrissey has been  
allowed to return in Paris.

Mr. WILKS, M. P. P., from this County,  
spoke to the point when, describing subsidies  
to steamers &c., he said that while honorable  
gentlemen were urging for subsidies none of  
them had subscribed a dollar of their own  
money for boats on the different routes.  
When the people in York and Carleton  
wanted a boat they put their hands in their  
own pockets. He would be quite willing to  
surrender a part of the subsidy to the Flor-  
enceville if other facilities needed it more.
