A LETTER FROM GLADST NE -Mr. Gladstone sends the following autograph letter to the London Morning Chronicle :-" It is not my custom, for obvious reasons,

to comment on the statements made by bostile metropolitan newspapers but having a sincere respect for the Chronicle I call attenion to an allegation in its article that I have heretofore taught that nome rule would be 'a source of imperial danger.' I will not challenge you for the proof of this assertion, which I believe to be made in good faith, but it is entirely in error. So far as I am aware of my own teaching, it contains no such doctrine, but in general calls for explanations of the meaning of home rule, in order to clear up a question as to whether it would or would not be a source of imperial danger. We have now learned the demand of Ireland from the mouths of five sixth of her constitutionally chosen representatives. and it shows that home rule means the establishment of a legislative body in Ireland for the management only of Irish affairs, such home rule is, in the language of my address of last September, a source, not of danger, but of strength. The danger, if any, lies in refusing it. 




