exhibits of the Colonial and Indian exhibition in London. The Globe's Colonial Exhibition supplement says:—'New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island occupy another corner together. New Brunswick shows the way in corn to all the other provinces. In fact a gentleman who ought to know, says, 'The best corn we have comes from New Brunswick.' Further, the New Brunswick Board of Agriculture show some remarkably fine samples of wheat and barley, which have been judiciously arranged by Mr. Cornwall. The province is also to the fore in oats, beans and peas. There is here, we may note, one very particular head of Indian corn. The usual golden grain is in this instance speckled with grain of variegated colors—different shades of black predominating—which extends irregularly all over the head. Prince Edward Island is not very largley represented, but the province has, nevertheless, some excellent samples of wheat, corn, peas and barley. Nova Scotia shows up well in oats and beans, but the province's exhibits here seem to prove that red wheat and tares are its forte. 


