

has been brought before the Circuit Court of the United States in Kansas, known as the Kansas brewery case. The court decided that the State must compensate the owners of the brewery for rendering it useless by legislating against the manufacture of beer. In 1855 the New York Court of Appeal held the assize law of that State unconstitutional because authorized the destruction of existing liquors as inconsistent with the rights of property, but no case has gone so far as this Kansas, case, which asserts the rights of compen sation, not for the manufactured product, made useless by a prohibitionary law but for the manufactory itself. Hitherto the courts bave held that legislation of this kind was a lawful exercise of the police power. This is the view taken by Mr. Justice Cooley, of Michigan. In his work on constitutional re-

Mr. Justice Brewer says that it is shown that the brewery was worth \$50,000 for brewing purposes, but that for any other purpose it is worth but \$5,000. This difference the State must make good.
