Webster in his definition of the term states that "electricity is evolved in any disturbance of molecular equilibrium, whether from a chemical, physical or mechanical cause." baking coal are ground to a fine powder, and passed through a sieve. The powder so got is transferred to iron-plate moulds of the required shape. When the moulds are filled they are placed in a furnace and kept there till all carburetted hydrogen has escaped. They are next soaked in gas-tar thickened by boiling, and afterwards exposed to a high heat, when they are ready for use. Those in use here are manufactured in Cleveland, O., and cost about \$18 per thousand. The carbons in use are 12 inches long and 3-8 inch in diameter. They are connected with the wires and are kept 3-16 of an inch apart. Should they meet, the electric current would pass on and no light be made. the positive, burns twice as last as the negative. The lamps are so constructed as to regulate the regular movement of the carbons. The positive carbon burns about 9 hours. As the street lamps are double acting they feed the reserved carbons as soon as the first are exhausted, and can thus, without any oversight, maintain a light until We close this division by stating that the ROCHESTER LAMPS, light is found to be caused not by the combustion of the carbon, but by its being brought into a state of incandescence. It is important to observe, also, that the electric light can be produced in a vacuum and is therefore quite independent of the air. How






