





liquor tax-is about \$50.000 a year. To raise this \$50,000 the state has about 2000 licensed bar-rooms, and consequently there are 2000 bar-keepers who do not produce anything, but who are consumers. There are about 10,000 loafers, or dead-beats, who hang around the grog shope, who do not work, or at most work very little; so that adding together the 2000 bar keepers and the 10,000 loafers, we have 12,000 idle men in the State, who have to be fed and clothed at somebody's expense, and whose labor, amounting, at fifty cents a day apiece, to 6000 a day, is lost to the State. 


