Workings of Alcohol in the Human Frame.
From Father Chillingworth's "Fifty Years in the Church of Rome," Chap. xxviii, page 397.
(Continued from last week.)
But I determined to use no opportunity of continuing the study of the workings of alcohol in the human body. At the same time I was to make a complete study of anatomy under the kind and learned Dr. Douglas. It was from the lips and works of Dr. Douglas that I learned the following startling facts:

1st. The heart of man which is only six inches long by four inches wide, beats seventy times in a minute, 4,200 times in an hour, 100,800 in a day, 367,200 in a year. It sends out every day 100,000 gallons of blood, itself every time it beats, which makes 175 ounces every minute, 656 pounds every hour, seven tons and three quarters of blood which goes out of the heart every day. The whole blood of a man runs through his heart in thirty minutes.

2nd. The skin is composed of three parts placed over each other, whose thickness varies from a quarter to an eighth of an inch. Each square inch contains 3,500 pores, through which the sweat goes out. Every one of them is a pipe a quarter of an inch long. All these small pipes united together would form a canal 301,166 feet long—equal to forty miles, or nearly thirty-three leagues of canal.

3rd. The weight of blood in a common man is between thirty and forty pounds. The blood runs through the body in 100 seconds, or one minute and forty seconds. It sends 11,000 pints of blood passing through the lungs in twenty-four hours.

4th. There are 246 bones in the human body; 65 of them in the head, 24 in the spine, 16 in the wrist, 14 in the joints and 108 in the hands and feet.

The heart of a man who drinks nothing but pure water beats about 100,000 times, but will beat from 25,000 to 30,000 times if he drinks alcoholic drinks. Those who have not learned anatomy know little of the infinite power, wisdom, love and mercy of God. No book except the Bible, and no science except the science of anatomy is like the body of man to tell us what our God is, and what we are.
