





It has been the practice, hitherto, to allow FOR SALE BY shipments of goods to the United States, valued at less than \$50, to go forward without a consular certificate, but the station master has received an order not to accept any freight unless it is accompanied by the requisite certificate Many shippers had a habit of dividing their goods into small lots, so as to escape paying the consular fee, or undervaluing them for the purpose of keeping the amount below \$50. It was resolved at a recent conference of Consuls at Halifax that the Treasury department be recommend. ed to abolish the privilege of shipping goods in small lots without certificates. The fee for goods up to \$100 is \$100. No action appears to have been as yet taken on this recommendation, but so many consignments of smelts have been stopped at Vanceboro for undervaluation, the invoices being returned for correction, that the intercolonial has been
