LETTER FROM TOURIST.

No. 7.

Leaving Ingersoll by rail, I strike Hamilton, a city of some thirty thousand inhabitants, resting at the foot of a high mountain and fronting on one of the finest lakes in Canada. It has splendidly situated and fine schools with a handsome post office built by the Dominion Government recently. At the custom department I found a good deal of red tape. Some friends had put few small presents in my trunk, and these the officials had spread out over a large counter with clothes and dirty linen, but it took me the best part of a day going from office to office before I could get the duty levied and paid, which I can assure you I found annoying. While in Hamilton, I was the guest of Mrs. Isabella McGee Smith, who with her two sons and two daughters made my visit very pleasant. Mrs. Smith has an intelligent and well educated family. Her son, Ernest, lives on the homestead and is one of the first men in the county; he has the title of being the "father of the county." He has about twenty-one acres in grapes, from seven acres of which he raised this year twenty-one tons of fruit of different varieties and brought about sixty tons of apples to market. He is now, but he has demonstrated the fact that grapes can be successfully raised in Ontario. Some of these grapes were shipped to different parts of the United States and to the Northwest; they bring from 3 to 4 cts. per lb. by the quantity. He also raised four quarts each, which brought \$1 a basket at the cannery factory. From twenty acres of sweet corn he harvested fifty tons about two weeks ago, and the crop is doing very well, which, sold, including stalks, for \$50. Besides these he cultivated eight acres in tobacco, raising 300 bushels to the acre, and which brought from 21 cts. to 40 cts. per bushel; also he cut one hundred tons of hay, and raised apples, peaches and other vegetables. The other son is a civil engineer in the employ of a railroad company at a good salary. One of his daughters graduated as a M. D., and practices her profession in Kingston, and delivers lectures in the Medical Institute. An other daughter, with a Miss Alice Davis, of Burlington Ontario, has just returned from a tour of the United States. She is now settled in some part of Ontario. The third daughter holds an important office in the post office Money Order Department in Hamilton, and is a very capable woman. The fourth daughter is attending the high school and expects to graduate soon. It is pleasant to see the offspring of some of the oldest families in Ontario as well as in other places.
