CALIFORNIA has strawberries nine inches in circumference, or so the papers say "the papers say."

In New York, one day last week, 14,000 cases of flu were sold at auction, realizing \$200,000.

A QUEBEC tobacco company has booked an order from St. John, N. B., for 1,100 caddies of chewing tobacco.

STANSTED, Quebec, last week, decided by a majority of 159 votes to repeal the Scott Act in that county.

A lady with a hat 2 feet high and an additional foot of eagle's feather was seen on Regent street, London.

THREE lives in Mexico an Indian couple who are said to have been married 95 years, one being 120 and the other 111 years old.

At the Democratic National Convention, St. Louis, Mo., on Wednesday, Cleveland received the nomination for President by acclamation.

The entire cost of the recent Methodist Conference in New York, is stated to have reached \$75,000. Remittances to the conference from the churches were held \$7,500.

DON'T set your oil cans in sawdust. It is reported that a case of spontaneous combustion occurred in Rockland lately through leakage from an oil can in sawdust in which it had been placed.

A CENTURY figures that twenty years ago it cost for the management of the Dominion \$12,000,000 annually; ten years ago, \$22,000,000; at present, \$35,000,000, and estimates the probability of it being, in ten years hence, \$50,000,000.

A N. Y. paper says that the agent of the S. P. C. A. in that city liberated a number of small native birds on sale at an auction room. These birds, it is stated, were trapped at Woodstock, and the fact is stated that the penalty for trapping birds is a severe one.

On the 1st inst. in Philadelphia, under the operation of what is called the Brooks law, over 4,000 liquor stores were closed for good, leaving only some 1,200 places where liquor may be lawfully sold to adults. The law will still reduce \$373,000 in license fees from the redoubtable number of sellers.

TRADE returns of the United States show that while in ten months of 1886 and 1887, the exports of that country exceeded the imports \$58,230,000 in '86 and \$27,589,743 in '87, in the past ten months the imports exceeded the exports \$22,175,883. This is a singular illustration of balance of trade.

A VICTORIAN has been issued by the inland revenue departments calling attention to the fact that methylated spirit will hereafter be manufactured under the supervision of the department at Ottawa, and will be supplied to various makers and other business men at cost price. There are seven or eight manufacturers of this article, who will be compelled to discontinue its manufacture.

Savings Banks.
The Glade states that in April the bank, drawn from the post office savings banks of Ontario exceeded the deposits by \$196,700.

Death in the Lozenge.
A warning to children and, indeed, to parents, is in the fate of a little boy who died in Sao, Me., last week, from eating a box of worm lozenges on the train in which he was going to his mother's funeral.

N. P. Convention.
The National Prohibition Convention which is to meet in Montreal on July 8th, is anticipated with much interest. It is expected that there will be a notable array of the leading temperance talent in attendance, and lively discussions are also foreseen.

Fire.
The town of Hall, opposite Ottawa, has been scorched by a fire that broke out in the Court House on Tuesday. Some 400 houses were burnt, including a Catholic Church and a Presbyterian hall at \$80,000; 250 people are homeless; loss about half a million.

Mysterious Fires.
According to a statement sent from Fredericton to the Telegraph, a house in Millville, N. B., is being or has been visited by mysterious fire similar to those which caused such a conflagration in Woodstock a year ago, only that in Millville the burning was more disastrous to property.

Quickest Yet.
The Atlantic ocean voyage is being rapidly reduced as to the time required. The Canadian, "Utrius," made her last trip from Queenstown to New York in an hour less than six days. Within the memory of persons living, it took nearly that length of time to reach St. John from Fredericton by water.

Two young ladies grappled one another the pole of a galvanic battery and of course felt no shock. It was suggested that they kiss each other which they did, and the shock came, knocking one over and causing the other to faint. They were not injured but, no doubt, indulged in much thought as to the several modes of kissing.

That Tax.
Fredericton Council has virtually repealed the law under which license was exacted from commercial travelers for wholesale houses and mechanics. We believe Woodstock is now the only town in the Maritime Provinces where the exacting of such license is enforced. The Town Council might as well suspend the operation of an absurd law.

Ancient and Honorable.
A delegation from the A. & H. Artillery of London, is in America on a visit to the A. & H. of Boston; the visitors are being treated in a royal manner and are visiting the chief cities.

On Monday, the delegation were banqueted in Faneuil Hall. Previous thereto, there was a procession and a sermon which was delivered in the new Old South Church. "God Save the Queen" was sung before the benediction.

About Starch.
It would appear that the starch manufacturers of Arctostock, or some of them, fear the effects of the proposed reduction by Congress of the duty on starch from two cents per pound which it is at present to one cent. It is claimed that such a change in the duty would cause every factory in Arctostock County, which would be unable to compete with the potato raisers and starch makers of Germany and Holland.

Its Cost.
We are told that the Royal Labor Commission cost the country; the benefit of its work we do not yet know and, therefore, cannot rightly estimate the balance. A Toronto paper says—

The Royal Labor Commission cost the country \$20,000 for salaries and expenses, and yet the legislation which it was supposed would follow their report is not to come for another year.

A Woman's Champion.
Fred Douglas is championing the woman suffrage. In a recent speech he said that the emancipation of the women is a greater cause than that of the emancipation of the negro race, inasmuch as it concerns half the human race, while the emancipation of the people affected only 4,000,000 of people. Mr. Douglas says it is the same old fight. He believes that there is still a God in Israel, and that Douglas can play the role of Joshua.

St. Joseph's College.
The 23rd Annual Commencement of St. Joseph's College, Menomonee, takes place on the evening of the 21st inst. For the first time in the history of the college, the Faculty will confer Degrees, and hence the exercises will conclude their first really academic session.

A Warning.

Butter Factory.
There is a butter factory at Foxcroft, Me., which has a capacity of 400 pounds upon the average product of 600 cows. The entire cost of the establishment was \$1,900. The capacity could be increased so as to manufacture the product of 1,000 cows by an additional expenditure of \$100. We mention these facts as being worthy of consideration by farmers living in some of our best grazing districts and offering an opportunity for profitable investment.

St. Andrews Train.
A locomotive, first-class passenger car, and a combination car are being completed at MoAdam Junction to take the route between that place and St. Andrews. The train throughout will be a beauty and will be ready for the summer "side" travel when it begins. Imperial Federation.
Halifax had a big meeting recently to boom the agitation for Imperial Federation. It was especially notable for the interest shown and speeches made by clergymen. Archbishop O'Brien made the speech of the evening. While, of course, it is within their right to do so, yet we would much rather see the clergy lending their influence to cleanse and keep pure the political institutions we have, than to have them engage in the work of stirring to induce the people to embrace a theory, about the practical result of which, if obtained, no one knows, or, at all events, no one professes information.

In the police court, Moncton, a woman, Mrs. Wallace, was on trial for violation of the Scott Act. She carried a wheeled chair. Refusing to answer to the question whether she had sold liquor or not within three months, the sitting magistrate, R. Barry Smith, proceeded to make out a commitment for contempt; while he was engaged, the accused struck the prosecutor, Grand Juror, and was held in custody several times on the dock. Finally she answered that she did not recollect selling. The case was adjourned. The same evening, a number of her admirers presented to Mrs. Wallace a valuable diamond ring.

Change in the Itinerary.
The decision by the American Methodist Conference to extend the station term of its ministers from three to five years, may, probably, largely influence the Conference of the Colonial Methodist bodies and, at least, give an impetus to the feeling that prevails among them in favor of legislation in the same direction. The itinerancy is one of the ancient features of Methodism—an organization in regard to whose system of church government and methods of administration there has been as few changes in the last century as probably in any of the Protestant churches.

But there are evident inconveniences to both ministers and congregations connected with the short term itinerancy, which have long suggested the possibility of a change in this feature. But, possibly, when there are so many congregations to be satisfied, and such a diversity of style and ability among ministers, the present system is as good a one as any that could be adopted to be in harmony with the general objects of Methodism.
