OUR OTTAWA LETTER. (From Our Own Correspondent) Ottawa, May 22. Propagation is fixed for today and Lord Lansdowne for the last time dismisses the National Legislature.

A great deal of business and some lively excitement marked the last work of the session. Several Government bills were dropped including all clauses of the Franchise bill except the one suspending the revision of the voters list another year.

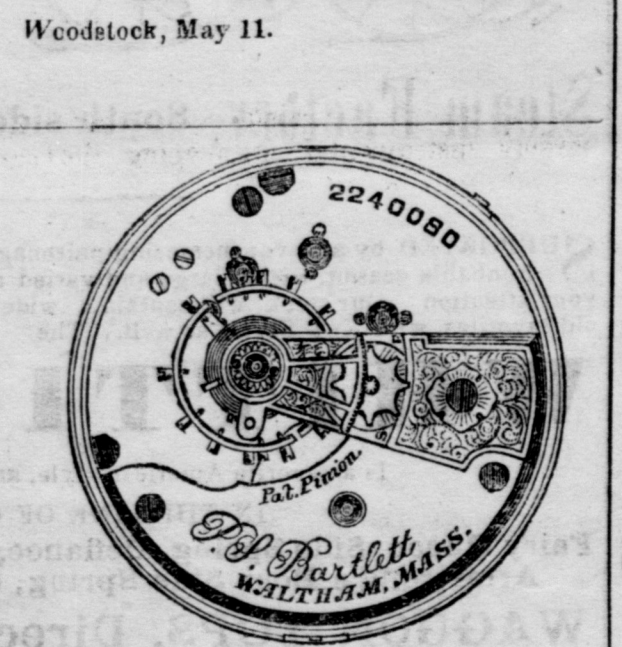

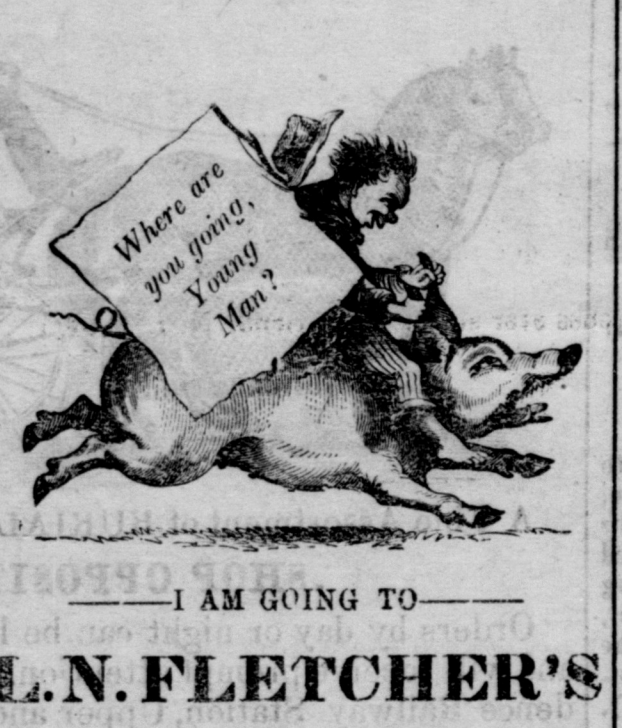
