Carleton Co. S. S. Convention.

Committee's Report on the Secretary's Report

submitted to the County S. S. Convention last

week. It was not to hand when we went to press

with the outside of this issue, and hence its oc-

cupying a separate place in this paper:—

REPORT OF COMMITTEE.

Mr. President.—Your committee appointed

to examine and report upon the report of the

secretary, respectfully submit the following:

The vice-presidents of this Association are the

connecting links between the executive commit-

tee and the Sunday Schools of this County. The

duties of these officers are to regularly visit

the schools of their respective parishes, to aid

these schools in all so far as they can to make

the work more effective, and to regularly report

to the secretary a statement of the strength, con-

dition and work of each school. They are also

to report as to where no schools exist, and the

advantages of endeavoring to organize new

schools, or reconstitute those that have become

formal. A proper discharge of the duties of

vice-president requires that the persons holding

that office should have an ardent love for the

work and willingness to devote time and labor

for the promotion of it. A neglect on the part

of the vice-president to perform the duties of

the office very seriously interferes with the

work of the executive committee, who must either

remain in ignorance of the condition and require-

ment of the work in the locality of such an

officer, or get their information through irregu-

lar, and often unreliable channels. We very

much regret that ten or fifteen years ago, when

the work was first organized, the secretary should

have reported, "that owing to the neglect of

some of the vice-presidents, the work of the

executive committee is "unable to present any

statement of the standing of the schools in the

County." The only remedy that we can sug-

gest is this, that in the appointment of persons

to fill that office, great care should be taken to

select the very best material available for

that purpose, and endeavor to secure persons

not only capable to discharge the duties of the

office, but who also feel the responsibility of

the work, and will willingly labor

for the best interests of this branch of God's

work.

We emphatically reaffirm what has so often

before been affirmed by this convention with re-

ference to the prominent habit of closing up

the Sunday school during the winter months.

There may be some exceptional cases where to

keep the school open each Sunday of the entire

year would be nearly, if not quite impossible,

but we believe there are very rare cases where

genuine love for the Master and His work should

enkindle in the heart of every one possessing an
