Notes by the Way. MESSRS. EDITORS:-Left Woodstock by the evening train at 8.45, local time. Arrived at McAdam at 12.05, a distance of 51 miles, having made the incredible speed of 15 miles an hour. Here, and at Vanceboro. we were detained two hours. At the latter place Uncle Sam had to examine our effects. We found, however, the Custom House offi cer to be a real gentleman, for although an entire stranger, he took my word as to what was in my trunk, and neither opened it nor my satchel. We left Vanceboro at 2.05, a. m., and reached Bangor at 7.15, a distance of 114 miles, averaging a speed of 22 miles an hour. Here we had 20 minutes for breakfast, which we had a good relish for. We left Bangor at 7.35 and took a west course for Kennebec river, and arrived at Waterville where the road leading to Danville Junction and other towns in the northern

part of the State connects with the main line and crosses the river at Waterville, while the main line continues on down the eastern side of the river to Augusts, where it crosses and follows the western bank down through Hallowell, North and South Gardener, and Richmond. Gardener may well be called the "city of saw mills." Sawing lumber seems to be the main business here I no-ticed, however, that the lumber which came down the Kennebec was very small; it looked like lumber out on ground that had been repeatedly culled. It is too small for either deals or clapboards. Sloops come up to Gardener to load. At Richmond we begin to draw away from the river and steam on for Portland, which we reach at 1, p. m., a distance of 136 miles in five hours and twenty-five minutes, almost an average of 27 miles an hour. Here we have 20 minutes for refreshments, and at 1.20 p. m. steam for Boston, which we reach at 5 o'clock p. m , a distance of 115 miles in 3 hours and 40 min-

utes, or an average of  $31\frac{1}{2}$  miles an hour. The country from Portland to Boston is mostly very level, and reminds a person of the western prairies. The farms are well cultivated, and the buildings though in the main not pretentious, yet very neat and have a look of comfort about them. But I am persuaded that the soil does not compare with ours, and by looking at the meadows a person could easily see why Boston has to get all her best hay from Carleton County. In my next I will give you some description


