

THE COMBINED EXHIBITION.

DEAR SENTINEL, -Some kind words which have received from friends in Carleton Co. induce me to attempt again to express a few thoughts with reference to the conditions under which an Exhibition might be held this Fall It is true, as I remarked before, that I have no right to speak of such matters, but no one who has an interest in agricultural things can fail to be impressed with the great advantages which Carleton County possesses for all the possibilities of high farming.

Probably no section of land of like area, on the continent, east of the meridian of the Hudson River, equals it in the proportion of strictly fine farming lands. We of Southern Aroostook Co. have a slice of that fine land on our St. John streams, and such townships are geographically a unit with Carleton. The impression produced upon the minds of travellers, when they first visit this section, is a

surprise to themselves and most favorable to our locality. One gentleman of extensive travel and keen observation said: "Your region is the equal of the valley of Virginia." Another of similar qualifications as a judge said, as we rode from Houlton to Woodstock, "Why, this is Western New York; nothing have seen, since leaving there, has brought

It is no matter of surprise, then, that with such an agricultural region there should be so thriving a place as Woodstock, or such a large number of thrifty and prosperous farm ers as are found all through the County. Again the move of two years ago to hold the first combined Exhibition was but th latest legitimate outcome of the existing situ-

The development of the railway line and its most efficient management made it possible to move large bodies of people. The few stout-hearted men, who assumed the responsibility, found that circumstances were with them, and a grand success was the result. If this train of thought is sound and true t follows that the nature of things in Carleton County now demands a recurrence of such farmers' festivals, either in the biennial or triennial period. This plan would, of course, make quite a change in the old order of things, but insemuch as innovation always begets opposition it is perhaps wise not to b discouraged at the appearance of such feelings in this matter, and all the more earnestly strive to meet and overcome the hindrances

in all possible ways. Opposition might be found to exist on account of two reasons, and, if these feelings adverse to a large show are honestly held, perhaps a candid discussion of them might tend to their removal. 


