History of New Brunswick.
The history of our Province, we may say, dates from the 24th June, 1604, when the French explorers DeMonts and Champlain entered the mouth of our noble river. Charmed with the harbor and the three islands it contained, they named it St. John, in honor of the day as they were celebrating the festival of St. John the Baptist on board ship.

If Champlain now entered St. John harbor, we can imagine his look of surprise as he would gaze upon the shipping and the city. It would be hard to convince him that it was not his father's harbor had entered and named two hundred and eighty years before. As he gazed upon our beautiful city, no doubt a feeling of sadness would arise in his breast that it was not his own countrymen who dwelt there but strangers who had taken it from him. But reflection hereafter.

In 1604 our first New Brunswick settlement was made on St. Croix Island at the southwest of the Province. Buildings erected and preparations made for spending the winter. When the winter broke in full force upon the lonely island, great indeed were the troubles of these early settlers. Not being accustomed to a cold climate the severe winter frost entirely disheartened them. To add to their suffering a strange disease broke out in their midst and many died. With the little colony would have perished. With their hopes revived, but they decided to remove everything portable to Port Royal and dwell there. The lonely St. Croix Island at this day has no tenant, except the light house, keeper, and some fishermen who sail from the river's rocky shores.

The next New Brunswick colony was made Grand Manan Island seven years afterward and consisted of twenty-two persons, two of whom were Jesuit priests. About this time several attempts for trading with the Indians were being made by the French. In 1621 King James of England, who claimed the right of the St. Lawrence, Sir William Alexander discovered, granted Sir William Alexander a charter to establish a colony on the St. Lawrence. Sir William Alexander and one of his first acts was to call his territory Nova Scotia, (New Scotland) and he named Scotch colonists who set out for Port Royal.

At this time two of the most important in the colony were Claude LaTour and his son Charles. The latter had built a fort at the mouth of the St. John but did not have time to occupy it as he was forced to return to France. After his departure a new man, D'Aulnay, was appointed Governor of Acadia and Charles LaTour was made his lieutenant. Trouble arising between them, Charles LaTour, in 1630, retired to his father's fort on the St. John, and built another some distance up the river at the mouth of the Joazeux. D'Aulnay, however, the St. John fort, and in 1647 in the absence of her husband, Madame LaTour was forced to surrender.

She was a brave woman, and her heroism in defending her husband's fort for several years is well known. The surrender broke her heart, and she died soon afterward.

After the death of D'Aulnay in 1650, his widow made the St. John fort her home, and he resumed his trade with the Indians. Two years later Madame D'Aulnay entered the fort with a new husband, a man named D'Aulnay, who was a French nobleman, and he was to recover her husband's fort, however, before he could take any action, another arrangement was made. Madame D'Aulnay induced no more to stay, and she and her husband left the fort, and she took him "for better, for worse," and let the fort go. Thus the feud of so long standing was settled. The St. John fort now became a mere trading post.

In this time fishing and trading relations were established between the French and the English. Temple was captured by an English commander, Major Sedgewick. Three years afterward Temple was captured by the French, and was held in Acadia, named St. John, Port Royal, LaRue and Penobscot. He abandoned the St. John fort and occupied the one at LaRue, which was better for trade.

By the treaty of Breda in 1667, between England and France, England gave up all Acadia, and the French took steps immediately to resume possession, and a man named D'Aulnay was sent to Acadia. He carried an order from the king of England to Temple, which read that he was to be the French fort, LaRue and Penobscot were to be surrendered. Temple refused on the ground that only LaRue and Penobscot were in Acadia, the English held St. John. A second order came from the king telling him to hold them on pain of death, so he was forced to resign them to Du Bourg. And again the French power was paramount in Acadia. A company organized in France now made several settlements along the St. John for purposes of fishing.

The English in Boston not adhering to the treaty of Breda, again began to annoy the Acadia French. Villon the commander at LaRue, read his fort up the St. John to the mouth of the New Brunswick River for consisted of four bastions, and was built nearly opposite the present site of Fredericton. Villon's policy was to make friends with the Indians and to persuade them to make war on the English. His success was not great, as the English came against him and besieged Fort New Brunswick. They were unsuccessful however and were forced to retreat. The next year Fort LaTour was rebuilt and Fort New Brunswick abandoned. The English again invaded Acadia. Fort Royal was taken first and then the other forts, and never since have the French had authority in Acadia. The English called the country by Sir William Alexander's name of Nova Scotia, and in 1713 by the treaty of Utrecht, France gave England all possessions of Acadia. From this time till 1759, a large number of settlements were made in New Brunswick, chiefly by the French who made their chief settlement at the mouth of the St. John, which they called Port Town from the name of the governor of Nova Scotia. The question of dividing Nova Scotia into two Provinces was then agitated, and in 1783 the Province of New Brunswick was created, and the river St. John made its boundary. General Carleton was made its governor, a council of twelve members and a House of Assembly with twenty-six members. The same year the town and district of Port Royal were incorporated and became the city of St. John. The first session of the Legislature met in St. John in 1786, and Governor Carleton expressed himself in one of his speeches, as much pleased with the sobriety, industry, religion and harmony between the newly arrived Loyalists and the old settlers. The next year the seat of government was removed to St. Anne's Point (Fredericton), as it was the

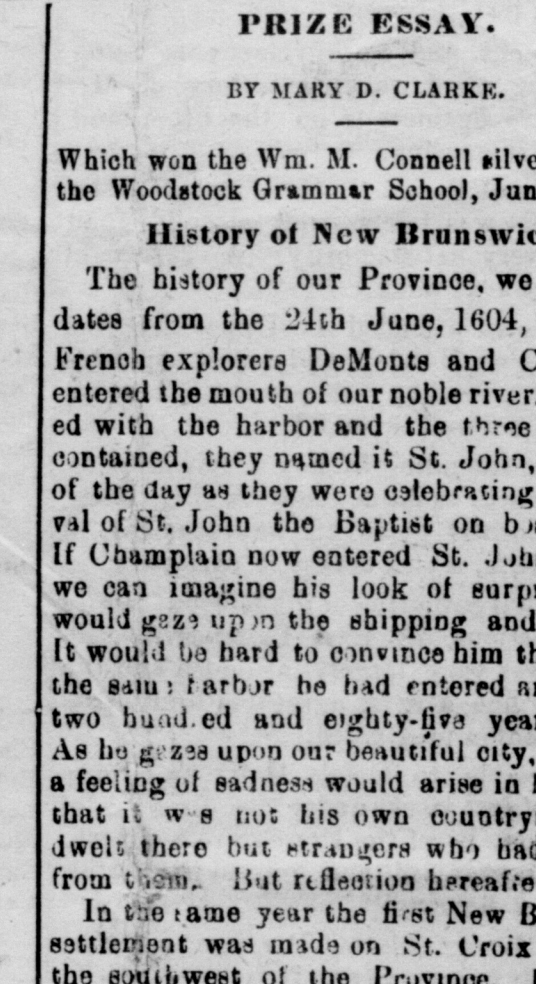

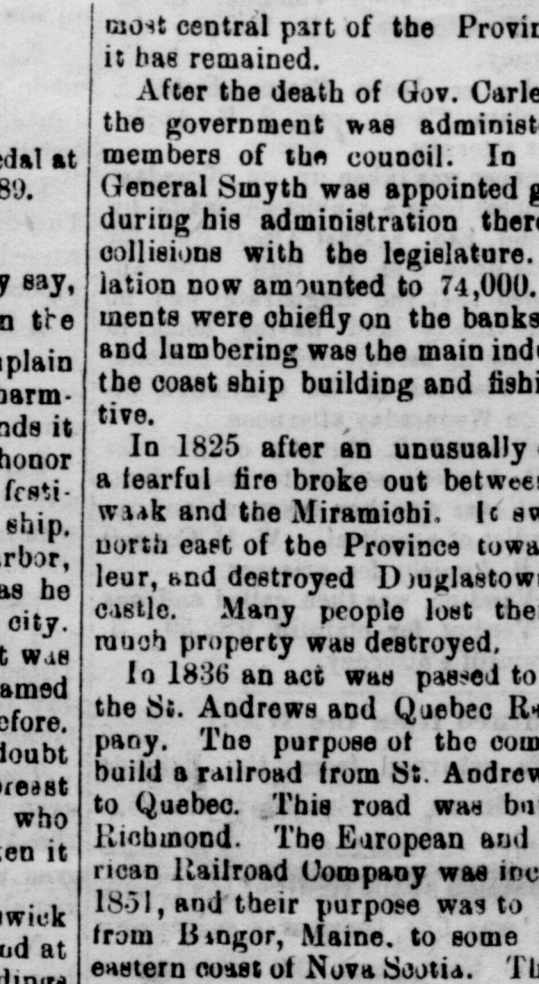

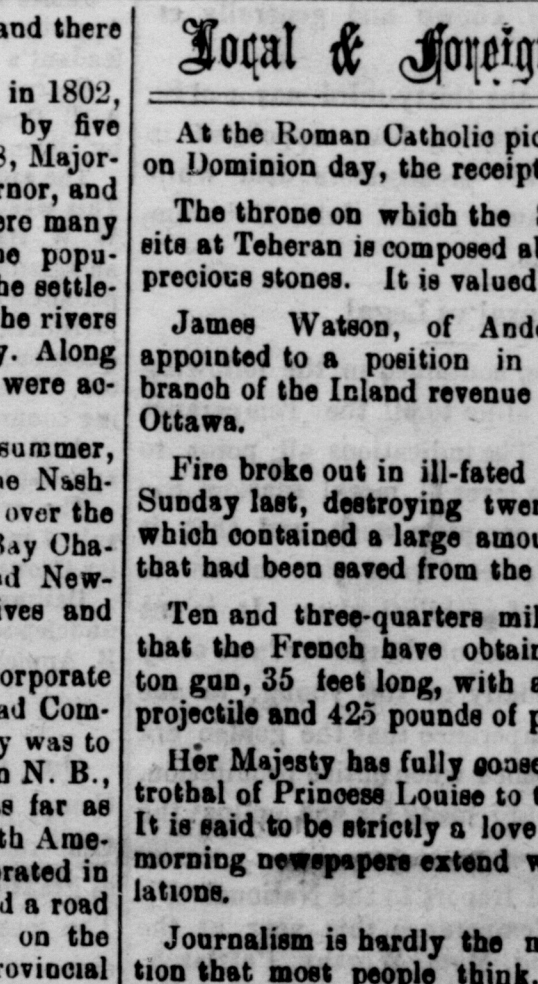
