

The excep ions have been where there was a strong intellect, a wholesome temperament, and peculiar social influences. Men and boys, women and girls, whatever may have been their culture, feel that there is something different in the streets at night than that which is in the day-something which excites apprehension or creates alarm, or gives licenses.
