



Up to a few weeks ago, says the St. Louis Globe Democrat, the British empire comprised an area of a little more than 9,000,000 square miles, or a small fraction in excess of the died the sway of the czar. To-day British territory reaches an area exceeding 11,000,-000 square miles. The treaty with Germany, by which the British "sphere of influence" extends from the castern coast of Africa at Zaczibar as far back as the great lakes, and that New York's new aqueduct are 30 miles long. It cost \$22,000,000 and 80 lives were lost in its construction. It brings 318,000,000 gallons of water to New York.

> It is only when a comparison is made with some of the great states of Europe and of the western hemisphere that the enormous di-mension of the British empire can be appreciated. The extent of European Russia is lightly in excess of 2,000,000 square miles. that of Brazii is about 3,000,000, while the United States, including Alaska, is about 3,-600,000 square miles. China is still larger than any of the nations last mentloned, having an area exceeding that of the United States by nearly 500,000 square miles. But the boundaries, is three times as capacious as the Joited States. Out of that domain could be carved a territory as large as this country, Brazil, and China combined, leaving enough over to make up two or three little states like France, Germany, or Austria.
