## Sunday School Methods.

The paper on "Modern Sunday School  
Methods," read by the Rev. E. M. Hill at the  
late meeting of the Ministerial Association is  
full of instructive points for superintendents  
and teachers of Sunday Schools everywhere.

We give a part of the paper below—  
The Sunday School must be looked upon  
as a means, and not as an end, by teacher and  
parent. The school, with its books, and  
music, and entertainments, will not save the  
youth. We have proof of that when we see  
a few of them drifting away into bad habits.  
The school is an influence for leading people  
to church, and then grounding them in the  
faith.

Parents are not helping so much as they  
might. They should see that the lesson is  
prepared. They should examine the scholar  
after he has returned home. They should  
occasionally go to the school to see themselves  
what is being done, and to show the child the  
value they place upon the school.

I hope to see a Home Department develop-  
ed in every school in the near future. The  
Congregational Sunday School and Publish-  
ing Society of Boston has made a good deal of  
this and published blank forms and literature  
to help in carrying it out. The main school,  
through its secretary or a special committee,  
recruits people who cannot go to the school  
to join this department. They promise to  
spend the hour that the main school is in  
session in study at home, or a half hour. The  
main school furnishes lesson helps and report  
cards and every three months gathers in the  
old cards and sends new ones. This draws  
in inactive, parents with babies, servant girls,  
etc.

We lose much good result by not testing  
knowledge by reviews and examinations.  
No day school would think of omitting re-  
views, and nothing acts as a greater stimulus  
to study and clear up thought like examina-  
tions. We are not demanding enough work  
on the part of the scholar.

I long to have the School put upon a basis  
more really allied to the day school. Parents  
think, reading, writing and arithmetic are  
necessary as a preparation for life; and in-  
stead of children going to day school. But  
they do not look upon Bible knowledge as  
a requisite and so are not so zealous.

The system that teachers must observe  
to secure the co-operation of parents in en-  
forcing discipline. Get parents to promise  
that they will have a system of monthly re-  
ports that are sent home to the parents, mak-  
ing attendance, behavior, participation in public  
exercises, and recreation.

Sunday School should do harm when it  
draws scholars from other Sunday Schools.  
For instance, one school starts a "boom."  
They have a new orchestra, a new building  
or something else. They see the opportunity  
to fill up the school. They make schol-  
ars and teachers agents. They go out and  
get everybody they can, and they are always  
telling the old friends and draw in one or  
two more. Then harm is done in the feeble  
school, and harm done to the character of  
the scholar. This is the way that the class  
of religious tramps is developed that never  
becomes attached anywhere, and do no good  
to any church. The remedy is for teachers  
to examine into the circumstances under  
which a new scholar comes to their class, im-  
mediately, and to encourage stability of at-  
tachment.

The officers of the school must exact rever-  
ence. The age is drifting from it. Yet no age  
has ever had greater regard for great ideas.  
We owe it to the youth, and to new converts,  
to teach them to handle holy things reverently.  
The superintendent should watch this, and  
the teachers should be his lieutenants for en-  
forcing this habit.

One method which never will have success  
is that which puts officers in school who do  
not lead exemplary lives.
