Farmer Replies to E. M. Shaw. To the Editors of the Carleton Sentinel:

Mr. Shaw, in reality, made no reply to my last article. He says his "friend advised him not to," and he took the advice. I would not trouble you again for space in your valuable paper, were it not for one thing, that is he made some statements that were not true, and I do not wish to see them uncorrected. He says "Brighton Farmer" as before makes his appearance behind the curtain and refuses to give his name? This is not true; how could he make his appearance behind a curtain? Then it is not true that he refused to give his name; has he been asked to give his name? When the election campaign was going on, there was a great deal of talk about the poor Farmers; as one of them wrote a letter for the great, asking Mr. Shaw for information, and signed himself a Farmer, as such Mr. Shaw replied to me; as a farmer I replied to him, as I had a perfect right to under the circumstances; there was no name asked for or refused. Then he says "he gives a rehearsal of his book." The book he speaks of is his own work; I thought it was something out of the ordinary line, but I did not know what was the right name for it. Then he charges Farmer of not being willing to give his name; I do not think Mr. Shaw speaks of low such and every one of the right of franchise; that is not true, that is just what he does believe. Then Mr. Shaw speaks of the "Barriers" set up between the two countries lying side by side, and statements refusing to make any concessions and keep up the "clinch." One that did not know better would think to hear Mr. Shaw that our statesmen had all to do with making a treaty between the United States and Canada. If Mr. Shaw does not know he ought to know that it is the United States statesmen that have refused to make a treaty. He ought to know that for 13 years it has been part and parcel of the National Policy to meet the United States on terms of better trade relations whenever they would do so. Turn to the budget speech of Sir S. L. Tilley the first year of the National Policy: Speaking of the new tariff he said "but provision was made that if the United States repeated their duties in part or in whole upon the products of Canada the Dominion would be prepared to meet with equivalent concessions." Mr. Shaw says "Farmer is stupid." That is only in keeping with the liberal cause. Mr. Shaw says "we feel that this country is going to victory, when we take into consideration the snappish election, the shortness of time given to the powers brought to bear with a gain of fifteen or more seats, and a get there by the side of the skin of their abject ministers." It is plain to be seen that Mr. Shaw does not know when his party is beat and it is because him to talk about the powers brought to bear. Look for a moment at the powers brought to bear against the Government. The Premier of every Province in the Dominion, the Grand Trunk Railway, the greatest monopoly on the continent, with all the money they could command, and the liberals offering to divide the U. S. O. R. between the G. T. R. and the O. P. R., if they would give their money and influence to defeat the Government, and after all that they come out of the fight with a majority of over 30; where Mr. Shaw gets a gain of 15 seats is more than I can tell; he does not know what the majority will be till the house meets. No doubt quite a number will go to Mr. Shaw and Farmer did, till over to whichever side they think is the strongest. I think Mr. Shaw had a good deal of brass to hint to me to "him how much I got to go over to the Tory camp without offering to tell me what he got for going over to the liberal camp. Had he said I will tell you what I got if you tell me what you got I might tell him; but I cannot tell you now. I might have got a promise to tell me what the Legislative Council, or it might have only been the natural instinct that causes rats to leave a sinking ship in time to save their lives. We will now look and see if Mr. Shaw is right in regard to a verbal of the "ablest ministers getting there by the skin of their teeth;" we will look and see how they did get there. Mr. J.
