Points for the Premier.

To the Editors of the Canadian Sentinel:

WASHINGTON LETTER.

(From our Regular Correspondent.)

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 6, 1891.

The National Legislative Council of the National Farmers' Alliance and Industrial Union is now holding its first session in the city. It is composed of the leaders of the State organizations, and is presided over by the National President. The object of this meeting is twofold: first, it will draw up a programme of measures that the Alliance will push in the Fifty Second Congress, and perfect those that are in a crude state as well as change those that it may seem desirable to change—it is believed that the sub-tary scheme will undergo material changes if it is not supplanted entirely by a new measure which will retain as many of the main features of the old one as the council may think that Congress will accept; next, the council will endeavor to get up a feasible and practicable plan for disseminating the literature of the organization among the masses, in order to create them in the same and interest of the Alliance. The politicians are greatly interested in the doings of the council.

The friends of the free coinage bill do not like the latest move of the opposition—bearing bills to Congress which they claim to be made solely for the purpose of killing the bill by delay. The opposition is unquestionably hating as it never hasted which shows that it is afraid to trust entirely to a Presidential veto. Senator Cockrell stated on the floor of the Senate that he had been several times in the committee room of the House Finance committee, and in one case it came near to being a brand new election bill, which met the views of those who had refused to support the old one.
