



For 10 successive years, 1881 90 inclusive, orders Canada exported an average of over nine milition bushels of barley, almost entirely to the United States. In 1890 the total export was 9,976,908 bushels, of which 9,939,745 bushels were tent to the States. In 1891 the total export was but 4,892,337 bushels, of which 4,751,952 went across the border in spite of the McKinley tariff. A sudden decrease of more than one-half in the export of barley must involve severe loss upon the farmers of Ontario. So far the much vaunted English market has not taken the place of the nearer market they have lost. Only 132,650 bushels of barley were sent from Canada to Great.
