"I look upon the question as definitely settled. In 1874 the export of cheese from Usuada was 24.050,982 lbs. In 1888 it had gone up to 40.255,523 lbs., and in the fiscal year 1891 to no less than 106, 202, 140 lbs. Last year the amount was still further increased. The last issue of the Trade Bulletin states that up to Oct. 15th the shipment of cheese from the port of Montreal alone this season 22gregated in value from \$7,750,000 to \$8,000,000.
