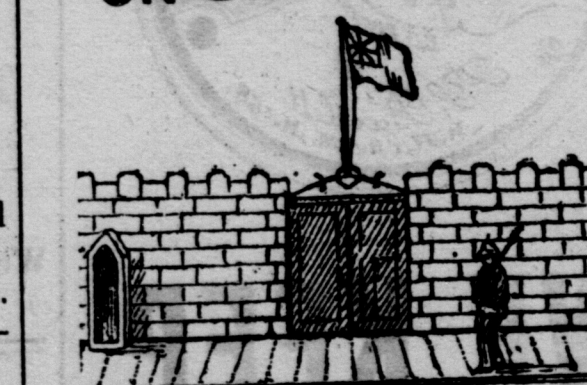

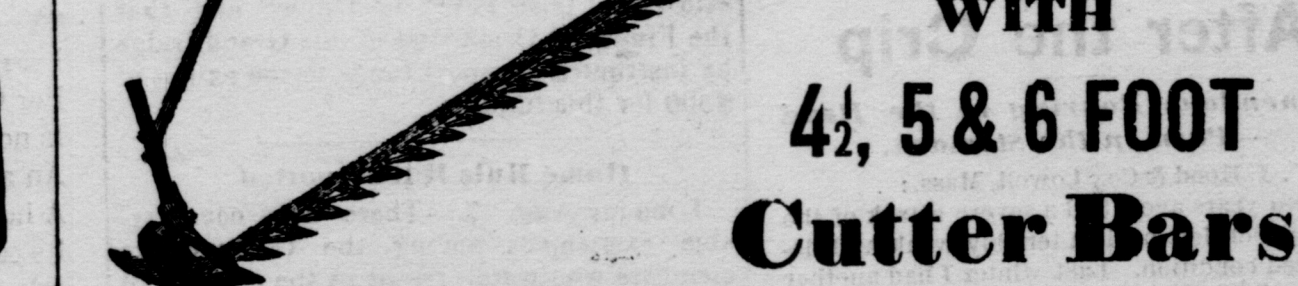

Covering a large portion of the Crown Lands of the Province.

THE right of License to cut and carry away all classes of Timber or Lumber, from the principal Timber Lands of New Brunswick, will be offered by public auction, by the Crown, on the 20th day of August, 1892, and following days.

The Timber Licensees to be sold will cover an area of about 4,000 square miles (or 2,500,000 acres) of Crown Lands.

These Licensees will be for one year, with the right of Renewal for a term of 25 years from the 1st day of August, 1893, on sufficient of all conditions of License.

Licensees will be offered at an upset price of \$5.00 per Square Mile, and condition being complied with, may be renewed from year to year during the term, on payment of \$1.00 per Square Mile, this mileage being in addition to Stumpage dues.

The Stumpage payable on lumber to be cut has been fixed for the present at the following rates:

ON SPRUCE, PINE AND HARD-WOOD SAW LOGS, \$1.00 per M. S. ft.

CHAD LOGS, 40c

HEMLOCK LOGS, 40c
