COLUMBUS, Ga., March 4.—Last night a terrible wind storm swept across several countries 50 miles north of Columbus. At Greenville, the county seat of Merriwether county, 38 stores and dwellings are reported to have been blown down, and but three business houses in the town were left intact. A negro woman was killed. Odessa, a small town near Greenville, is

reported io have been completely swept away. Six persons were killed there.

At Woodbury, 10 miles east of Greenville, houses were blown down and trees uprooted. About two miles from the town two negroes and one white child were killed. Many are reported to be seriously wounded.

A heavy snow fell at Woodbury this morning. At Molena, Pike county, a church, academy, planing mill, two stores and several recidences were blown down. A white woman named Mrs. Fell and four white woman named Mrs. Fell and four

negross were killed. At Piedmont, a few miles from Molens, only two houses out of twenty remain standing. A lady named Hawkins was killed and her parents were badly wounded. Almost every one in the town was wounded to some every one in the town was wounded to some extent. But meagre information can be obtained from points distant from the railroads.
