Prayer in Elections.

The Breckenridge contest in Kentucky just virtually closed with the late Senator's defeat, was a remarkable one. Before the Pollard scandal occurred, Breckenridge occupied a proud position in his state and in the country. Pollard naturally, in the estimation of his former constituents, his defeat was decided upon and not only were all the usual means, including platform and personal canvass used, but the pulpit furnished the most powerful aid. The Breckenridge women made it subject of prayer in their homes and public gatherings and special meetings for prayers for his defeat were repeatedly held. Breckenridge's defeat is a victory for good morals.

Our Streets.

There appears to be a general concurrence of opinion as to the deplorable state of our Main street. It should not be very difficult to ascertain the respective cost of different systems of road making and the, at least, approximate amount of money necessary to expend in making the portion now in the worst state permanently good. Our own view is that macadam is the best and, in the end, the cheapest method. As to the amount of taxation involved, it being agreed that the work should be done, the principal may well be left for the future to discharge while the interest would not be a very large sum.

Reparation.

It is of course a pleasant fact in itself that some 40,000 French Canadians living in New England have, during the present season, returned to the province of Quebec. It may properly be regretted that the circumstances under which most of these people return. It will not be claimed that any patriotic or sentimental feeling has moved them primarily to the change. The S. A. Journal estimates the movement as one of the results of hard times in the United States, and states that: "None of these people are likely to cross the St. Lawrence again, and their homeward movement has been watched with pleasure by the working people of New England. Their presence, particularly in the lumbering centres, tended very greatly to cheapen the price of labor, so much that they were called the 'Chinese of the East.'" So that if we, who gain this added population, are glad, those who lose them are glad as well, and this is not a very gratifying feature of the case.

They evidently come back as they went away and as others all over the country are going and coming, under the influence of a present existing state of business affairs. Of course many of the French Canadians have farms, which they abandoned, to return to.
