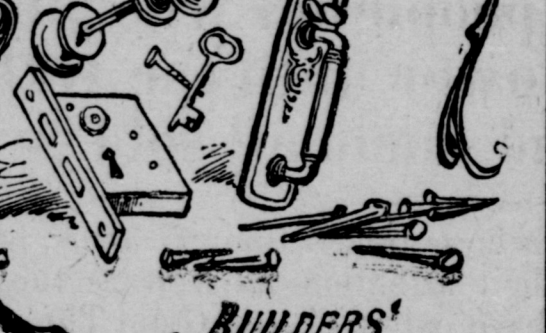

The first public session of the Mock Parliament, was held on Wednesday evening last, in Soboley's Hall. White, had taken the chair, and the members had been sworn in, the speaker from the throne was read. The Hon. Peters, Secretary of State. It was a fine effort for a young man, and Mr. Peters gave promise of being an able debater. It is H. A. Clarke, Minister of Justice, seconded the reply in a neat and witty speech. He was applauded by Mr. Gallagher, the leader of the Opposition. He made a vigorous attack on the policy of the government, which drew forth some witty sallies from both sides of the house. After speaking for a short time, Mr. Gallagher moved an adjournment of the debate until next Wednesday evening.

Great interest is manifested in the R. T. T. Every week new members are added to the roll, and the good work goes steadily on. It is rumored that a well known legal light has hopes of once again co-opting an ex-School Act League, and wrestling the palm of victory during the biting frosts of winter.
