



War Scare. London, October 25.—The Times published to-day a despatch from its Hong Kong correspondent, who says that he learns from shoroughly trustworthy authority that a treaty was recently concluded between China and Russia, by the provisions of which Rus is obtains the right of anchorage for her fleet at Port Arthur, the right to construct and work under Russian management the Nortchinek and Tritsibar, Vladivostok and Tritsichar and Port Arthur railways and other commercial advantages to which the "most favored nation" clause in other treaties is not applicable. China, however, reserves the right to purchase the railways after twen ty years at a price to be settled upon hereafter.

The Times remarks editorially upon the startling character of the despatch, and says it expects an official denial will be made, but hims that such a denial may be ignosed. Russia, it adds, cannot possibly imagine that the Powers will view with indifference an enterprise which would constitute the destruction of the existing balance of power, and which is almost unparalleled in its audacity. Russia is well aware that the magnitude of the changes in the movement now reported are such that she could not carry them out unless she had definitely resolved to abandon the pacific policy of the last reign and plunge into vast and dangerous activity.

The Standard says it finds it difficult to besieve that the alleged treaty between China and Russia has been negotiated. Probably something of the kind is meditated and the statement is floated as a feeler. Anyhow the suggested arrangement could not be allowed to stand, nor would there be any delay or hesitation in acquainting those concerned or the utter futility of the project.

The Chronicle dilates upon the gravity of the situation. England, it says, can regard the question calmly, yet firmly, and await final news.

London, Oct. 28.—The Graphic states

London, Oct. 28.—The Graphic states that it has high official authority for saying that the report received by the Times from its correspondent in Hong Kong, to the effect that China accords Russia the privilege of anchoring her fleet at Port Arthur and of building railroads connecting Vladivostock and Port Arthur, bears no reemblance what ever to the actual facts of the negotiations between China and Russia. "Moreover," the Graphic continues, "Russia has not approached the crisis in an anti-English spirit."

London, Oct. 29.—A despatch to the Globe from Hong Kong under to-day's date, says: Wong Chi Chuan was appointed last fall by imperial edict to go on a special mission to Russia, ostensibly to congratulate the new Casr upon his succession to the throne, new Car upon his succession to the throne, but really to convey to St. Petersburg a secret treaty, conceding the right to Russia to carry the Siberian railway through Manchuria to Vladivostock and to construct a branch ris to Vladivostock and to construct a branch railway from Teitsikar and Moukden to Viadivostock. 
