## ST. JOHN CORRESPONDENCE.

A Budget of News Notes, General and Personal.

About eighty guests were entertained on board the S.S. Lake Superior this afternoon. The tables were laid with the most elegant silver and the menu was equally enjoyable. The credit for the establishment of the Beaver Line of communication with Liverpool appears to be largely due to the energy of Mayor Robertson, whose loyalty to St. John has always been one of his marked characteristics.

A plaster cast of the late Bishop Medley, Metropolitan of Canada, is on exhibition at J. & A. McMillan's. It was executed by J. J. Mills, of New York, who spent some months in the city last summer. It is a very creditable piece of work; it will be used as a mould for a bas relief in bronze, which will probably occupy a place in one of the city churches.

The father of Nettie Sullivan, for a criminal assault on whom John P. Wells, the banker, aged 50, is serving a month's sentence in the county jail, purposes to bring an action against the aged Lothario for seduction when he is set at liberty. The opinion prevails that all the parties implicated in this disgusting affair are tarred with the same stick and are equally guilty.

Belle Mahoney, aged 20, an inmate of a Lower Cove reformatory, drank carbolic acid last night and is now in the hospital; it is thought she may recover. She claims that the poison was taken by mistake.
