ST. JOHN LETTER.

The philosophy of life—General news—The markets, etc.

Nicola Tesla says he believes a man might live two hundred years if he would sleep most of the time. His belief is not sustained by the experience of the world. Everywhere we meet men and women whose lives, mental and physical, are lethargic, but they rarely become centenarians. The idiot who merely eats and sleeps rarely attains the average of human life. The farmer, the artisan, the professional man or the student who is without ambition and drowns his life away has never been celebrated for length of days. The almost universal desire for wealth or knowledge which grows stronger with the accumulation of the one or the other, may be taken as evidence that man was created for activity, mental or physical, and that "sleep most of the time" would be more likely to shorten his life than to prolong it. Few men who have lived what we call a long life have been able to tell how it was accomplished. They worked with their hands or brains, amused themselves, ate, drank and slept like other men, as they suppose, and credit "a good constitution" with their vigorous and prolonged old age. But an eminent London physician has lately said that in civilized countries the average of deaths from old age is less than one in a thousand; the other 999 die from preventable causes. It is possible, therefore, that men might live two hundred years if they were surrounded by favorable conditions and always preserved their equilibrium, without "sleeping most of the time." Those 999 deaths in every 1000 are due to the diseases of infancy, most-

ly resulting from the ignorance or neglect of parents and guardians, epidemics which arise from a disregard of the laws of health, accidents for which the victim or some one else is always accountable, diseases that originate in unnecessary exposure, over exertion, over eating or over drinking—something in which the lower animals in their natural state never indulge—or anxiety, which embraces inordinate ambitions of every sort, and despondency over things which cannot be retrieved, and which, perhaps, is the deadliest of all. We shall not live to be 2
