Ottaws, July 13. The Dominion Government has adopted an entirely new line, so as to protect the Canadian Laborer and give him the benefit of the home market, something which the late administration never attempted Is fact, an entirely different policy was pursued, with the result came into Carada, pocketed the money for their contracts and left the Canadian laborers, who did the work, without any pay. Parliament had to be appealed to in some cases, and legislation was passed against the railways to provide the wages of the workmen who were so defrauded. The case of the Toronto, Hamilton & Buffalo Railway is a recent example, but there are numerous instances in Manitoba and the Northwest Provinces where workmen have been shemefully treated, and never hed an opportunity of redress. In the first place, the government had decided to put the alien labor law in force in Manitoba, the North-West and British Columbia, so as to protect the Canadian Workmen on the Orow's Nest Pass railway. The act can be put in operation by the minister of justice, Six Diver Mowats, appointing an agent to edminister the act. It is therefore likely that agents will be appointed at Winnipeg, Leth-bridge and Rossland, and probably other points in the west, without delay, so as to set the alien labor law in operation. The course is not boly contemplated in connection with the Crow's Nest Pass, but the same precaution will no doubt be taken wherever it is found necessary in the interests of Canadian Workmen in other provinces and at other points in the Dominion We Is addition to the protection afforded by the alien laber law, it is understood that the government has an understanding with

the Canadian Pacific Railway to give the preference to Canadians in all cases. The minister of customs has also issue an order to all collectors of quetome, reply to persons who may some from the United States to work on the railways.
