Plebsicite Campaign.

The call is now made on all advocates of prohibition to give earnest and practical expression to their principles in and by organizations in preparation for the approaching plebsicite.

On our first page is published a memorial on the subject, issued by the executive of the New Brunswick Prohibition Plebsicite Campaign Committee, in which it is clearly stated what is asked and required of the friends of prohibition in this county.

As will be observed, by notices in this paper, the campaign is to be opened vigorously in Woodstock on this Saturday evening, at which eloquence of speech and song will be presented.

To Be or Not To Be.

Our readers will have considered the several views advanced by members of the county council, regarding the wisdom and economy of erecting a new goal and court house on the county grounds in Woodstock.

The town council have taken steps to procure legislation in order that the town may give \$1000 towards the expense of erecting new buildings here.

As to how much new buildings would cost must of course be a matter of speculation until the character of the buildings have been decided upon and expert estimates prepared.

This fact may be considered. Supposing that new buildings can be erected for \$20,000 that would involve an annual expenditure for interest at 4 per cent of \$800.

It has been, and probably correctly, estimated that taking one year for the amount of repairs and renewals on the old buildings amount to an average of \$1,000 annually.

Well, if to the \$800 for interest was added \$200 annually for a sinking fund, while the present cost would not exceed that annually expended for repairs, in a limited number of years the entire debt would be extinguished and the county would be free of all incumbrances.

Then, of course, proper elements to enter into a discussion of this question is the convenience and financial advantage to the county of erecting new buildings.

An incident of the occasion was the coming of Mrs. W. F. D. Davis, from an extended visit to friends in London. Quaker Mrs. Davis is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Murray. Mrs. Alison Todd, of St. Stephen, and Mrs. Murray's sister, was also present.

Then to the greater convenience for the county were the sessions held in town rather than at the corner.

All these several matters, in connection, are fit subjects for discussion; and one of them requires further consideration in order to arrive at definite conclusions.

We shall return to the subject again, meaning to treat the whole body of people who will consider it free from all feelings of local prejudice.

May Join.

All officers of dismounted corps of 74th and 67th regiments, or who are about to be promoted to field rank or appointed adjutant, are eligible to attend the course if not already in possession of an equitation certificate.

Officers from rural districts who take quarter to St. John to enable them to attend this course will be allowed transport and \$1 per diem for each day they attend, provided they obtain a certificate.

Normal School and University Exams.

The examinations for Normal School entrance and University matriculation commenced on Tuesday and are not concluded as yet so to press. The examinations are being supervised by Inspector Meagher, assisted by Mr. Alice Graham and Mr. W. L. Tracy, principal of the Grafton school. There were 90 applicants for admission to the Normal School entrance examinations; two for superintendence and three for University matriculation. With a few exceptions all the candidates are from Carleton County. Of the 90 applicants for admission to the N. S. entrance examinations, there are for class 1, 57 for class 2, and two for class 3.
